FOUNDATION (Prep) ENROLMENT PROCESS

To start primary school in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old.

If your child is starting Foundation (Prep) in 2025, you will be able to apply to enrol your child in a Victorian Government Primary School from the start of Term 2, 2024 (Monday 15 April 2024).

This year our school will use an online system for new enrolments. All primary schools in Inner East and Outer East areas of the North East Victoria Region are using this online system.

The online system will be available for parents who are applying to enrol their child in Foundation (Prep). An application form can be completed on laptops, PC's and mobile phones. The online system will also allow you to upload documented proof of residential address.

It is important to note that the placement policy is followed by all government schools. The placement policy guides us in considering enrolments before confirming availability. The priority order is to accept in this order;

- 1. students for whom the school is the designated neighbourhood school
- 2. students with a sibling at the same permanent address who are attending the school at the same time
- 3. where the Regional Director has restricted the enrolment, students who reside nearest the school
- 4. students seeking enrolment on specific curriculum grounds
- 5. all other students in order of closeness of their home to the school.

Victorian government school enrolments for Foundation (Prep) for the 2025 school year will **open from Monday 15 April 2024**, the start of Term 2. Families are asked to submit enrolment applications by **Friday 26 July 2024**. The link to apply for a place online at Ringwood Heights will be available on this site from the beginning of Term 2 (April 15).

Prior to April 15, you can indicate your interest in enrolling in our school by leaving your contact details, mobile and email address by emailing or phoning the office. We will email the online enrolment link to you when the system becomes available.

Read below to hear from some of the students in JS about what they are doing to build their learning muscles during Wonder Workshop.

Lily - I like Wonder Workshop because I like to make cards for my buddy, Chloe. My buddy is really kind, and I like her. I made her a Golden Word poster with all the Golden Words that I found!

Amara – In Wonder Workshop I was working on an Auslan puzzle. I have loved learning about Auslan the most because it's fun. I like learning about the alphabet. I'm still practising the letter 'A'.

Noah – Did you know that the Easter Bunny came to school? In Wonder Workshop, I wrote a card for the Easter Bunny to say thank you for coming.

Ted – I'm making a Space Book. I have been drawing the planets and writing their names. My favourite planet is Saturn because it has a ring around it.

Learning Team 3 Literacy Update

Authors write to persuade when they are trying to change your thinking, feeling or behaviour. We have been learning about the different tools authors use so that they can be really persuasive. High modality words are really strong words that give the reader no option, like MUST, ABSOLUTELY and NEVER. If an author makes something seem a lot better or worse than it really is, that's called exaggerating. Like this is the best article ever in the history of newsletters! Authors can repeat the same word or words many times to add emphasis to their writing. Emotive words are used to make the reader feel something - calling something "tragic" is more persuasive than saying it is sad. A rhetorical question is used to get the reader thinking, without actually expecting an answer because it is so obvious. There are also tools like The Rule of 3 and Alliteration that can be used together like this: It was a sizzling, stunning sunset!

Here is Alana's example of the persuasive devices being used to convince you that Summer is better than Winter.

Why pick winter over the other seasons? That would be absurd! Summer is most definitely the best season of the year!

Firstly, there is ice cream. Sweet, creamy goodness that melts as you lick its cold, flavoured, tasty and thick heavenly substance frozen sweet. It won't be nearly as enjoyable in winter.
